Dear Mr. Sutton:

This is in response to your request to register the pending installation of burners to allow use of No. 2, 4, and 6 fuel oils under 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Section 106.261 at your facility near Galveston, Galveston County. The information submitted in support of your request has been evaluated and found to be insufficient to determine whether a]] the requirements of the exemption claimed in your registration request and/or 30 TAC Chapter 106 have been met. Therefore, we cannot confirm your claim of this exemption at this time.

Deficiencies are summarized below:

- 1. The 200-hp boiler (less than 10 million Btu/hr) to be modified allow combustion of various fuel oils was reported]v to exempted under Standard Exemption No. 7 (SE 7) dated August 11, 1989. This exemption restricts fuel use to natural gas, liquid petroleum gas, fuel gas, first run refinery grade diesel or No. 2 fuel oil that is not a blend containing waste The hours of No. 2 fuel oil use were not oils or solvents. restricted under the August 11, 1989 version of the exemption.
- 2. No. 4 fuel oil use is allowed for a maximum of 720 hours per year as backup fuel only under the current version of SE 7 or 30 TAC §106.183. If you plan to use No. 4 fuel oil, then you are required to comply with all applicable sections of the

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current version of §106.183. If the conditions of §106.183 are too restrictive and the expected hours of operation are greater than 720, then the agency has allowed use of $\S106.261$ provided each condition of such exemption can be met. simple §106.261 checklist as included with your submittal narative dated October 14. 1998 is not sufficient. Α description of the basis for the ves. no. or NA response should be provided for each condition.

3. The use of No. 6 fuel oil has never been allowed under SE 7 or §106.183. The information submitted to date under §106.261 is incomplete. As for item 2 above you must document compliance with each condition of §106.261.

If exemption conditions cannot be met, then a new permit or amendment of your existing Permit No. 8680 is needed for vour proposed modification to allow use of fuel oils. An amended permit may limit the hours of operation using different grades of fuel oil to hours significantly less than those specified in your exemption request. Please include all previously-assigned Resource Conservation Commission Account Texas Natural ID. permit. exemption registration numbers or in vour new submittal.

You are reminded that Sections 382.0518(a) and 382.057 of the Texas Clean Air Act, Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 382, provide that a construction permit must be obtained or a exemption fully complied with before work is begun on the construction of a new facility or modification of an existing facility that may emit air contaminants.
