This is in response to your letter dated March 26, 1997 concerning the existing compressor engine at the Panhandle Field Compressor Station 20. We understand that the engine was originally installed in 1972. After evaluation of the information which you have furnished, we have determined that your project is exempt from the permit procedures under Standard Exemption 7 from the Standard Exemption List dated May 8, 1972. We also understand that the unit is a Superior 8GT-825 Engine rated at 1,100-horsepower.

A copy of the exemption in effect at the time of installation is enclosed. You must operate in accordance with all requirements of the enclosed standard exemption.

You are reminded that regardless of whether a permit is required, these facilities must be in compliance with all rules and regulations of the TNRCC and of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency at all times.
