We understand that the cold process core machine authorized for relocation from Building 3908 to Building 804 by Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) letter dated May 2. 1995, Permit No. 214B will remain in Building 3908. Therefore, four isocure core machines will operate in Building 3904 and no isocure core machines will operate in Building 804.

After evaluation of the information which you have furnished, we have determined that your proposed changes will not increase the emissions from the facility. On this basis, no changes in the exemption status will be required. The information which you supplied will be incorporated into the exemption file.
